The current Committee was formed at the SIG AGM of the 2023 Milan World Congress. During 2023-2024 the Committee met 3 times via teleconference (meeting dates: 27/1/2023, 13/4/23, 2/11/23), and held an Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the World Congress in Milan on 1/9/23. There was also a social event for SIG FORWARDS members in Milan.

Other Educational Activities

FORWARDS member Sophie Lebel visited the Netherlands (Marije vd Lee, Melanie Schellekens, Judith Prins and Jose Custers) to strengthen collaboration and disseminate knowledge on FCR among researchers and clinicians. A travel grant of Sophie Lebel and Jose Custers was funded and Jose Custers visited the institute of Sophie Lebel (Ottawa) and Christine Maheu (Montreal) to strengthen collaboration and learn from each other.

Newsletters & Social Media

We send two times a newsletter to all our members, which shares recently published FCR research, as well as opportunities to engage in FCR research and educations. IPOS advertises these opportunities to the wider IPOS community via the IPOS newsletter. Several FORWARDS members also actively promote FCR research on X.

Collaborations

A Delphi-study led by dr. Custers (Radboudumc, the Netherlands) on features of fear of progression in advanced cancer patients receiving systemic treatment was conducted from December 2022 – March 2023. Six members of the SIG are in the steering committee of the project and 22 SIG members participated in the Delphi rounds.

Several other FCR-related studies by teams made up largely of FORWARDS members are ongoing such as a systematic review of FCR measures by Christine Maheu & Tania Estapé and translations of the FORT intervention into Spanish and Turkish.

2. Goals, objectives and results for 2023

We aimed to facilitate collaboration on research projects in the priority areas identified in the two Delphi studies that were conducted by our members:

- Intervention research to facilitate greater access to FCR treatment, specifically for LMIC and indigenous communities | Several papers were published in this priority area.
- Evaluation of the effectiveness of FCR interventions in real world settings | Results: several studies were conducted and evaluated in real world settings. These were presented at the IPOS World Congress in Milan.
- Defining the mechanisms of action and active components across FCR/P interventions | Results: Several papers were published in this priority area. A work-session was organized at the IPOS World Congress to disentangle active components between fear of cancer recurrence and fear of progression.

3. Description of issues/challenges experienced in 2023

The webinars were restricted to English-speaking people, closed captions in English is available, but unfortunately, we did not succeed in finding funding for using a live-translation tool to translate in Spanish or other languages.

It is difficult to reach out and engage early-career researchers and identify their needs. There was no response to a needs questionnaire for early-career SIG FORWARDS members sent in August 2023.

4. Goals for the next 12 months: 2024

We continue to facilitate collaboration on research projects in the priority areas identified in the two Delphi studies that were conducted by our members:

- Intervention research to facilitate greater access to FCR treatment, specifically for LMIC and indigenous communities
- Evaluation of the effectiveness of FCR interventions in real world settings
- Defining the mechanisms of action and active components across FCR/P interventions In addition to these priority areas we will identify new research priority areas by means of a survey to our FORWARDS members.

Furthermore, we aim to continue with quarterly webinars on FCR available to FORWARDS members and the IPOS community and to continue to promote activities of FORWARDS like activities for early career researchers to engage the membership.

5. Any special requests/needs for the next 12 months

In order to make our research results available for a diverse group of IPOS members it would be really helpful if we could translate the webinars in different languages. As we were not yet successful in obtaining funding I would be very helpful if IPOS could help in this matter.
